Composting 101 and Five Strategies for Success in Nebraska

Please join WasteCap Nebraska and Eco-Cycle International for an informative webinar on Thursday, September 18, Noon-1:30 CDT.



Presented by Brenda Platt, co-director of the Institute for Local Self Reliance, who is a national composting expert and lead author of two recent reports "Growing Local Fertility: A Guide To Community Composting" and "The State of Composting in the U.S.: What, Why, Where and How".

Composting has great potential to stimulate rural economies, protect our food supply, conserve water and reduce waste. Ms. Platt will explain what composting is, why it matters, give an overview of the infrastructure needs and where things stand in the U.S., and explain all of the benefits that composting can bring.

Nebraska is well-positioned to reap these myriad benefits with an existing network of local

composting facilities. We'll discuss the five key local Nebraska actions to move forward on composting, from small-scale education campaigns that promote backyard composting, to pilot programs that collect food waste from residents and businesses. We'll also discuss longer-term strategies for Nebraska to convert its nutrients from garbage to gardens.

Zero Waste Infrastructure Tours

WasteCap Nebraska is hosting its 2014 Sustainability Summit: Road to Zero Waste on October 28th and 29th at Embassy Suites-Downtown in Lincoln, Nebraska. This year WasteCap has added tours demonstrating Zero Waste Infrastructure on the 28th. Attendees will have the opportunity to visit (Option A) Assurity Life Insurance Company, Nebraska Innovation Campus, and EcoStores Nebraska or (Option B) Recycling Enterprises and Prairieland Dairy.

Assurity Life Insurance Company

Assurity Life Insurance is a state-of-the-art facility, located at 20th and "Q" Streets. A tour of the LEED Gold Assurity Center office building will highlight the use of layout and technology to provide a pleasant, flexible and collaborative work environment. The Assurity Center was the first privately owned major office facility in Nebraska to achieve LEED Gold Standard Certification. Learn how waste reduction and recycling infrastructure was built into the facility.



Nebraska Innovation Campus

Nebraska Innovation Campus is a new facility located adjacent to UNL. It is research facility for UNL faculty, students, facilities and private sector businesses. The construction was uniquely designed to promote sustainability and innovation in food, water, fuel issues, computer and medical technology. Participants will take a guided tour through the new facility to learn about how innovation and sustainability were integrated into the design.



EcoStores Nebraska

Ecostores Nebraska is a great place for remodeling projects. They have cabinets, used paint, walls, flooring and more. They reduce waste in landfills by salvaging materials that can be

reused to enhance another space. EcoStores Nebraska will provide a tour of their deconstruction materials resource center providing information about the hard-to-recycle materials accepted.



Recycling Enterprises

Recycling Enterprises will demonstrate the operation of their Materials Recovery Facility [MRF] showing how they sort and process mixed materials for recycling.



Prairieland Dairy

Prairieland Dairy won the *Outstanding Dairy Farm*Sustainability Award from the Innovation Center for US Dairy in 2013. It sits just 20 miles outside of Lincoln. Tour participants will learn about their commercial composting operation, water filtration and wastewater recycling systems, as well as their environmentally friendly farming practices. Prairieland Dairy offers commercial composting for local businesses, organizing pick up and transport of food wastes.

More than 2 million tons of materials are landfilled each year in Nebraska. This practice wastes valuable resources and threatens our air, groundwater and climate. Creating a resource recovery-based system will not only conserve resources and protect our environment but it will create and sustain more productive and meaningful jobs than a disposal-based system. Federal, state and local governments play a critical role in protecting our natural resources and creating the structures, regulations and incentives surrounding waste disposal and resource recovery. In 1992 Nebraska communities were required by state law to develop 20-year solid waste management plans. Few, if any, have come close to meeting their plan's waste diversion goals. Why? What needs to change? What can governments do at each level to create incentives and frameworks through which Zero waste systems and infrastructure can develop?
